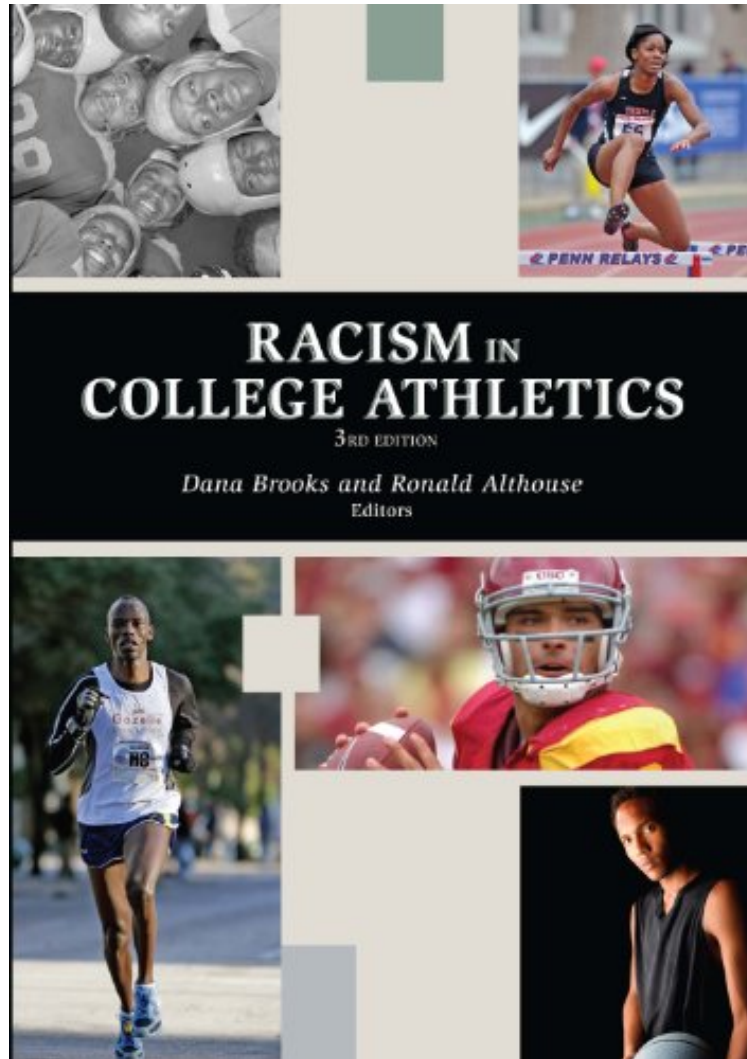

He has published and presented nationally and internationally in the area of sport sociology. Brooks is also co-author of *Diversity and Social Justice in College Sports*. He has authored or co-authored manuscripts that have appeared in *Quest*, *Sports Management*, *Journal of Strength and Conditioning Research*, *Journal of Physical Education and Recreation*, and *The Journal of African American Men*. He teaches *African Americans in Sport* and *Sociology of Sport*. His numerous honors and awards include Dean's Recognition Award from the College of Health Professions, Towson University Alumni Association; Martin Luther King, Jr., Achievement Award, WVU Center for Black Culture and Research; WVU Social Justice Award; and the Martin Luther King Living the Dream Award, State of West Virginia. Brooks is a fellow in the National Academy of Kinesiology and served as president of the American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance. He recently was awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award from Hagerstown Community College.
