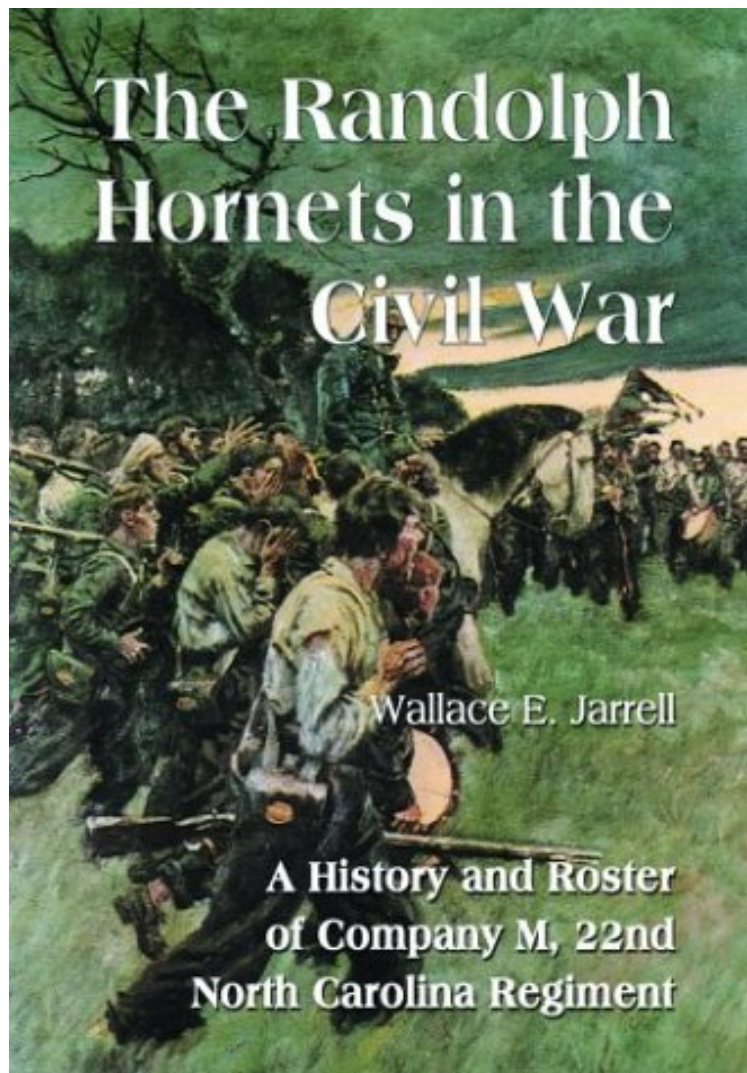

You also get to meet some of the officers and men of Company M, L, I and Company A such as 1st Sgt Marcus Deal who mustered in as a Private and was promoted to 1sr Sgt of Company A after being returned in a POW exchange in 1864. He had been wounded and captured at Gettysburg.The book includes photographs and hard to find information. A great read for anyone interested in the war but a must for those interested in the role of the North Carolina citizen-soldier.

This book conveys the history of the Randolph Hornets and the company's members through both official and personal accounts. Articles by Sergeant John T. Turner in 1914 recalling his experiences with the company are included as well as an in-depth history of the company battle flag, its capture and its return to the county. A complete roster of the company includes genealogical information and short biographies for several of the men. The final chapter provides information about the local reenactment group based on the company, whose performances provide a sense of the hardships of 19th century military life.
