Originally published in 1909, these are the memoirs of W. A. McClendon during his time in the Civil War, serving under Generals "Stonewall" Jackson and James Longstreet in the Army of Northern Virginia.

About the Author William A. Gus McClendon joined the 15th Alabama Infantry Regiment, and served in many of the eastern theater engagements. More than fifty years later, he penned his reminiscences, still an unreconstructed Southern patriot, although able to look back with some amusement on his younger self.
