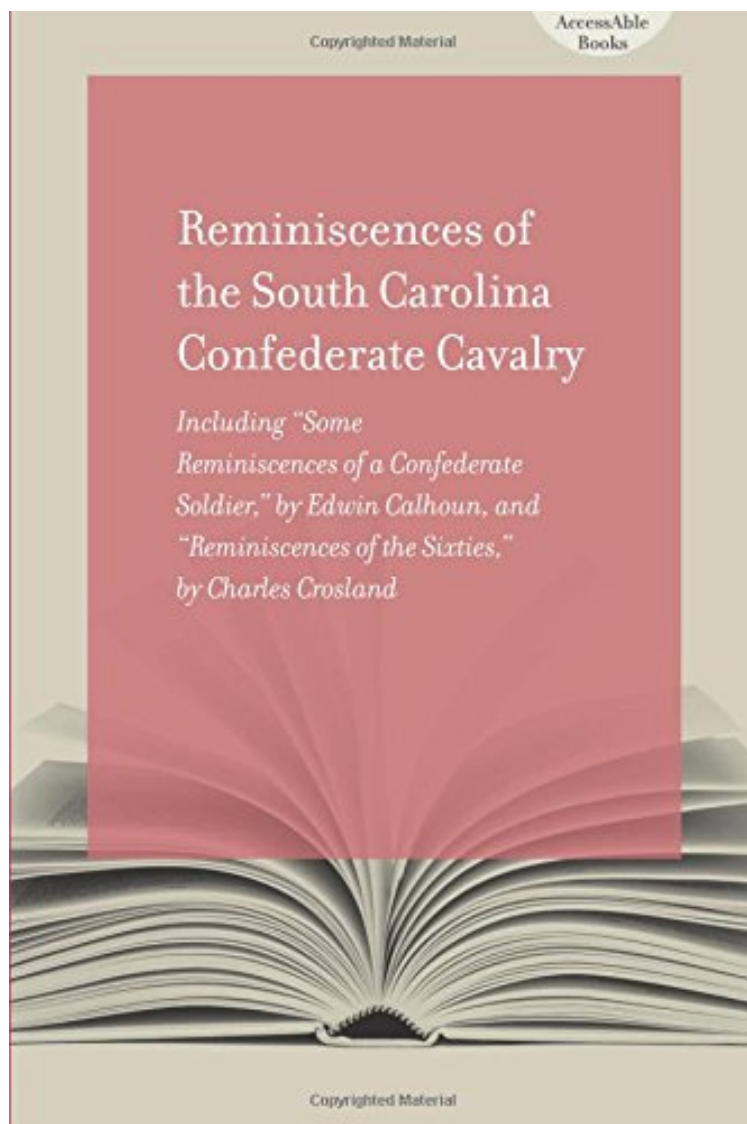

The second is one of the best memoirs I've read, *Reminiscences of the Sixties* by Charles Crosland. Crosland joined the Hampton Legion in 1864 and was present when the infantry regiment was given horses so they could serve as mounted infantry. His accounts of battle deal with the part of the Siege of Petersburg that occurred north of the James in the area southeast of Richmond. The Legion was part of a small brigade of cavalry under Gen> martin Gary. They played a key role in the battles of first deep bottom, second deep bottom, Fort Harrison, Darbytown Road and Second Fair Oaks. Bryce
