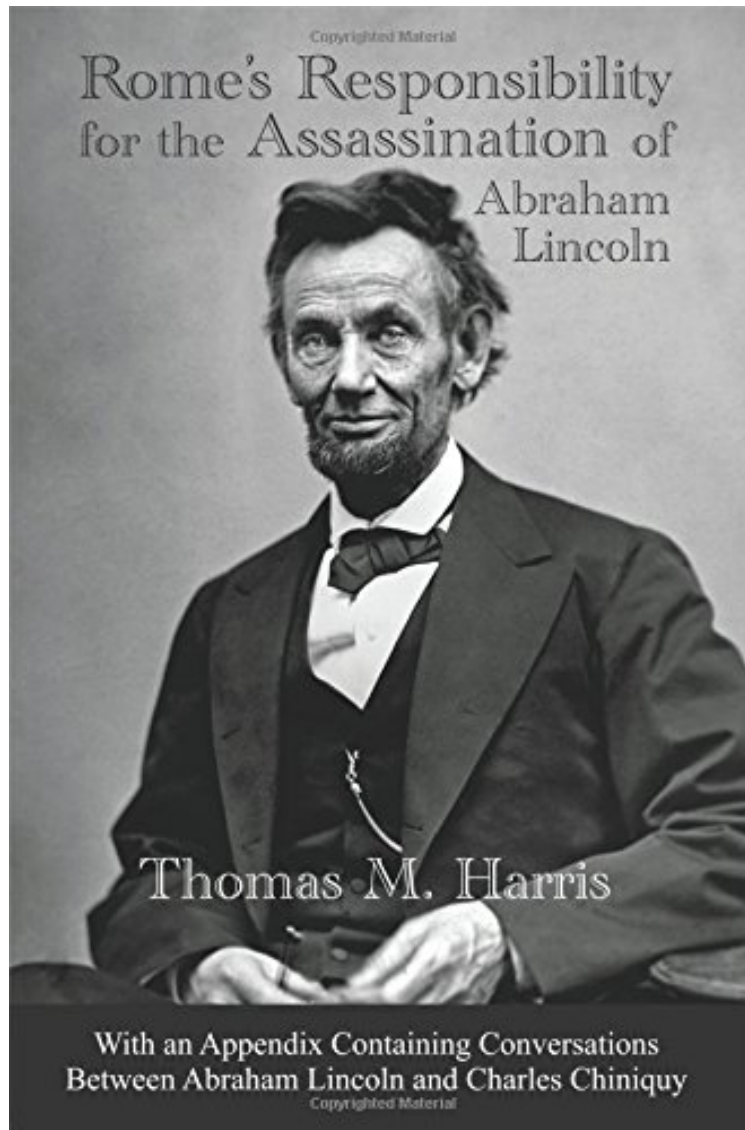

Brigadier General, doctor, and member of the investigating U.S. Military Commission Thomas M. Harris wrote this in 1897, thirty-two years after Lincoln's Good Friday assassination. His desire was to expose what had been covered over, based on the 371 witnesses and seven-week trial. We see how co-conspirator John Surratt was shepherded by two priests; into Canada, then Britain, and finally inside the Vatican where he found employment in the 9th company of the Papal Zouaves, under the name Watson. When the inevitable happened a year later and he was discovered by U.S. investigators, the diligent Pope Pius IX immediately arrested him. Strangely enough Surratt managed to escape, eventually apprehended November 27, 1866, in Alexandria, Egypt. Other evidences are overwhelming: 100% catholicity of plotter Mary Stuart's household, Catholic medal worn under murderer John Wilkes Booth's vest and over his heart at death, and announcement by priests in the Catholic village of St. Joseph of the assassination three hours before it happened. The Crime of the Ages was fittingly carried out by the criminal of the ages, that great whore of Revelation 17.5, the Roman Catholic Church. The most disturbing thought is, if she could exert such influence 150 years ago, what has it grown into today?

The author of this book, General Thomas Maley Harris, was a medical doctor, who recruited and served as commander of the Tenth West Virginia Volunteers during the Civil War. He rose in rank through meritorious service to become a brigadier general in the Union Army. General Harris established a reputation for faithfulness, industriousness, intelligence, and efficiency. He was noted for his leadership in preparing his troops and leading them in battle. He was brevetted a major general for "gallant conduct in the assault on Petersburg." After the Civil War, General Harris served one term as a representative in the West Virginia legislature, and was West Virginia's Adjutant General from 1869 to 1870. General Harris was a member of the Military Commission that tried and convicted the conspirators who assassinated President Abraham Lincoln. He had first hand knowledge of the sworn testimony of the witnesses in that trial. This book summarizes the salient evidence brought out during the military trial and adds information from other sources to present before the public the ineluctable conclusion that the assassination of Abraham Lincoln was the work of the Roman Catholic Church. The Roman Catholic Church has been largely successful in suppressing the circulation of this book. This book has never been given a place on bookstore shelves, as it exposed too much for the Roman Catholic hierarchy to tolerate. Any display of this book would bring an instant boycott of the bookstore. It is only now, in the age of the internet, where the marketplace of ideas has been opened wide, that this book can be found by those searching for the truth of who was behind the assassination of Abraham Lincoln.
