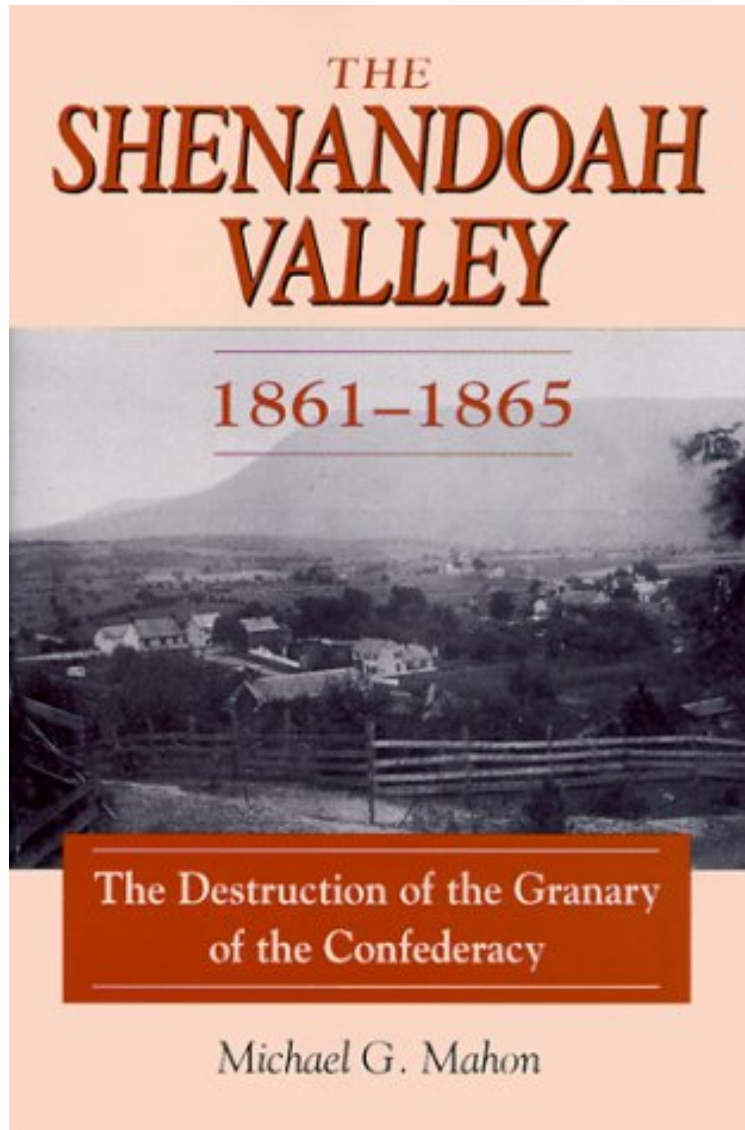

G. Mahon's book, "The Shenandoah Valley" is a good book on the economic impact this area had on the early United States and the Confederacy during the Civil War. He begins with a comprehensive look at this part of Virginia prior to the war and then continues through the military battles that were fought up and down this valley. Mr. Mahon uses historical information, coupled with first hand stories, to explain why he believes that the idea of the Shenandoah Valley was the granary of the Confederacy and its destruction led to the fall of the Southern States is wrong. This is a well written, yet easily read book.

Has the significance of the Shenandoah Valley during the Civil War been overestimated? An extensive array of primary sources--including Philip Sheridan's official report--point to this revisionist conclusion.
