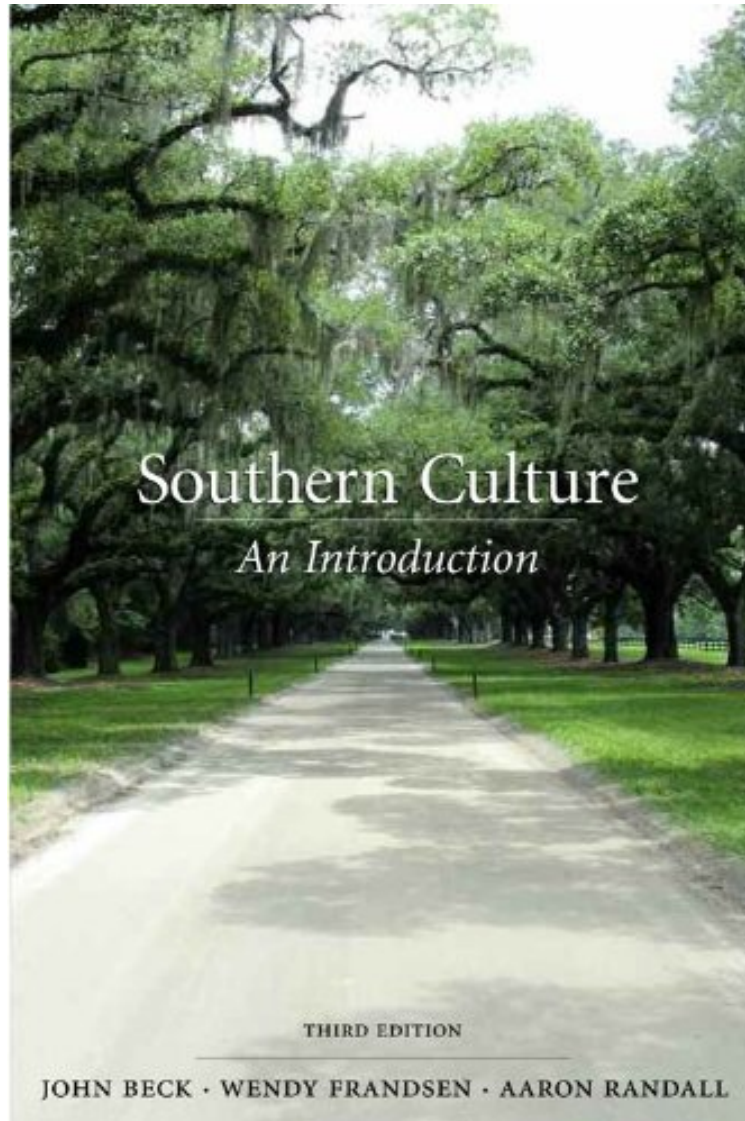

From the very beginning the South was different. The source and significance of this difference has been debated and discussed for over 200 years.
