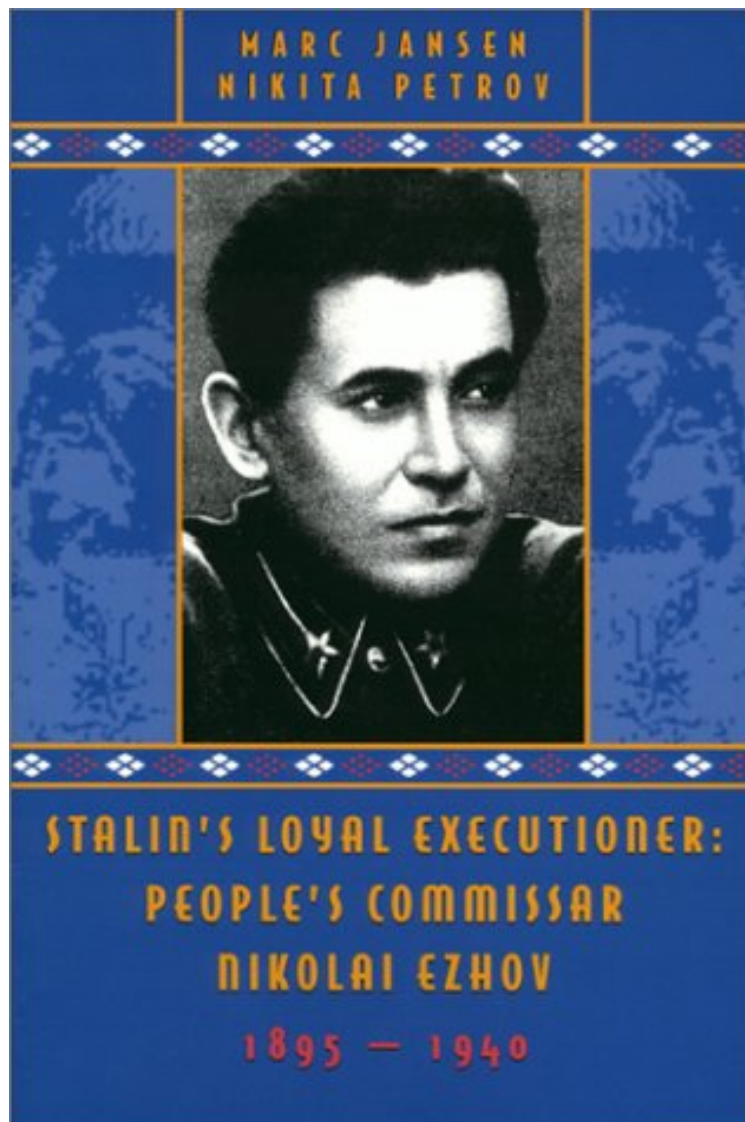

Under Yezhov, the Great Purge reached its height during 1937–1938. 50-75% of the members of the Supreme Soviet and officers of the Soviet military were stripped of their positions and imprisoned, exiled to the Gulag's camps in Siberia or executed. Many ordinary Soviet citizens were accused by local Chekist troikas and punished to satisfy Stalin and Yezhov's arbitrary quotas for arrests and executions.
