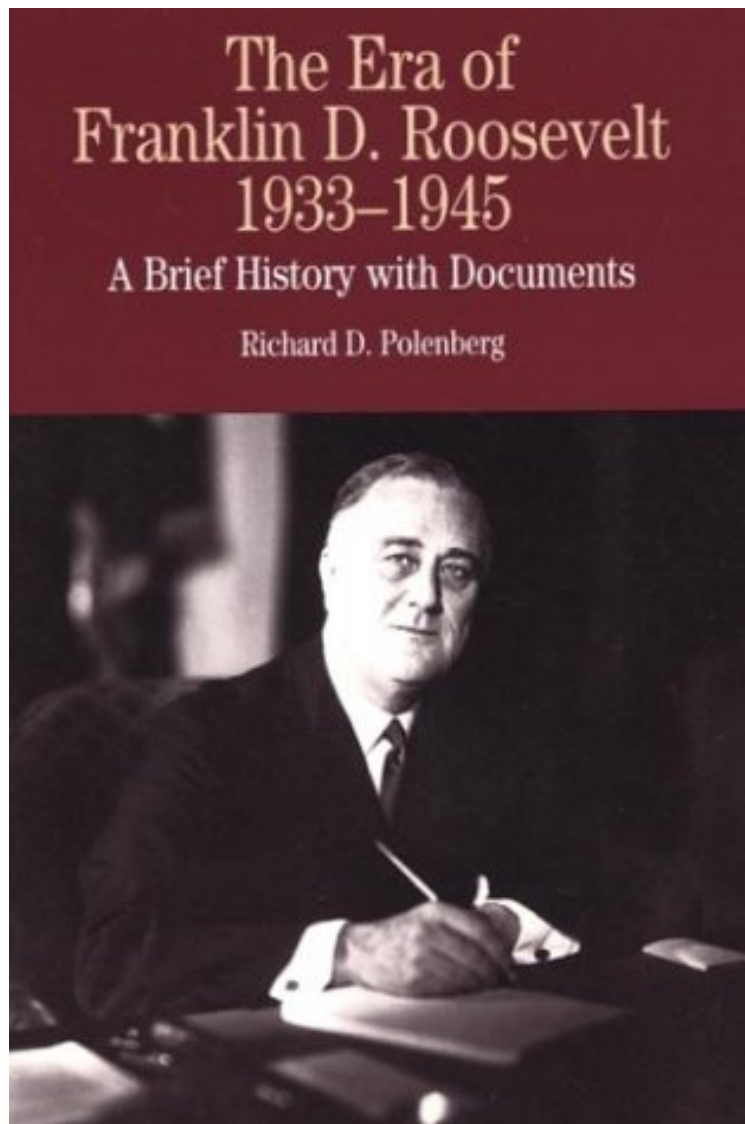


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## The Era of Franklin D. Roosevelt, 1933-1945: A Brief History with Documents (Bedford Series in History Culture (Paperback))
