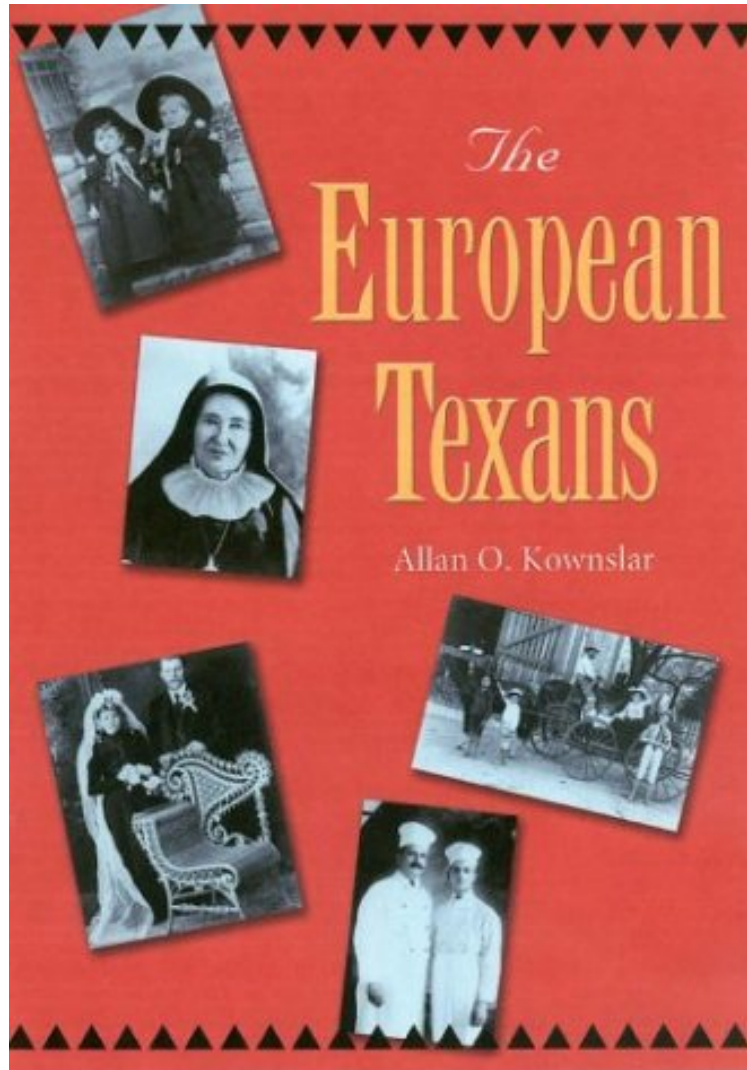

But European emigration also had an effect on the people who stayed behind in Europe, as seldom documented, but as expressed in the letters one family wrote to their Texas-immigrant relative and documented in the book Man of Two Worlds.
