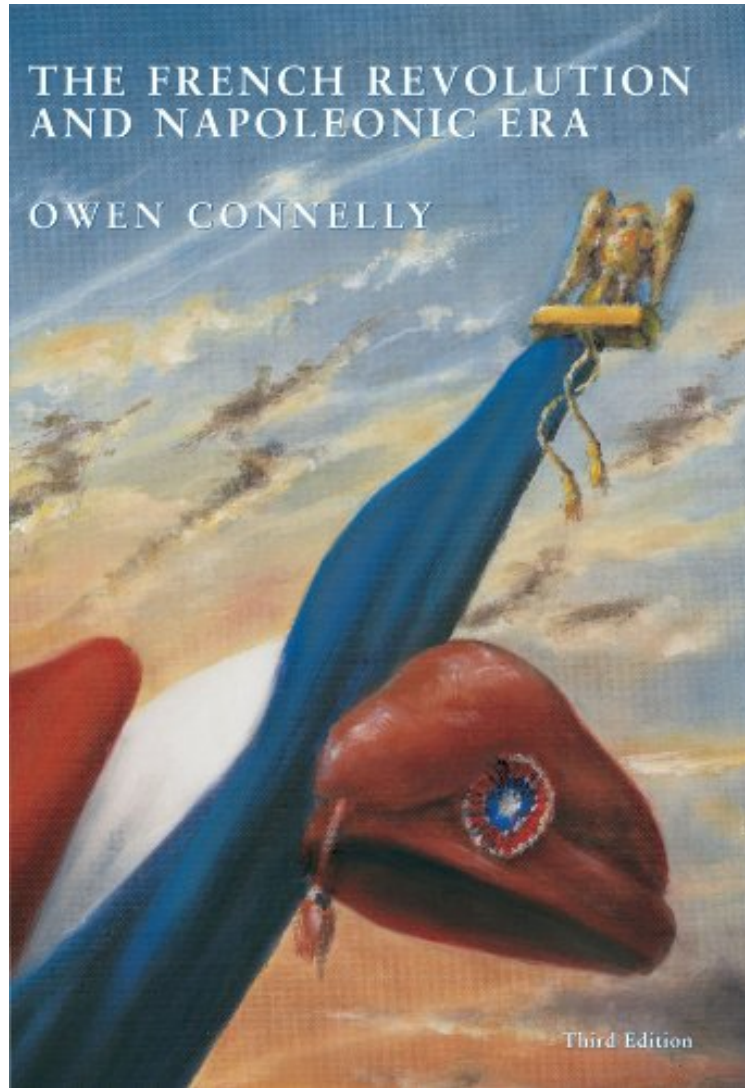

The political regime was both popular and open, but certain events like a population explosion and famine caused a prefect storm which ensured Louis XVI losing both his crown and head. A long list of idealists like Danton, Robespierre, and Murat shake up events but in the end also get their due. This is a short read which will explain the basics. At a little

over 150 pages, you will understand what happened in France in 1789. However, you will not have all the details on the political regime that fell. Louis XVI was not an evil man, but his political leadership lacked a lot, and this caused the basic political structure to be overthrown in a relatively short time.
