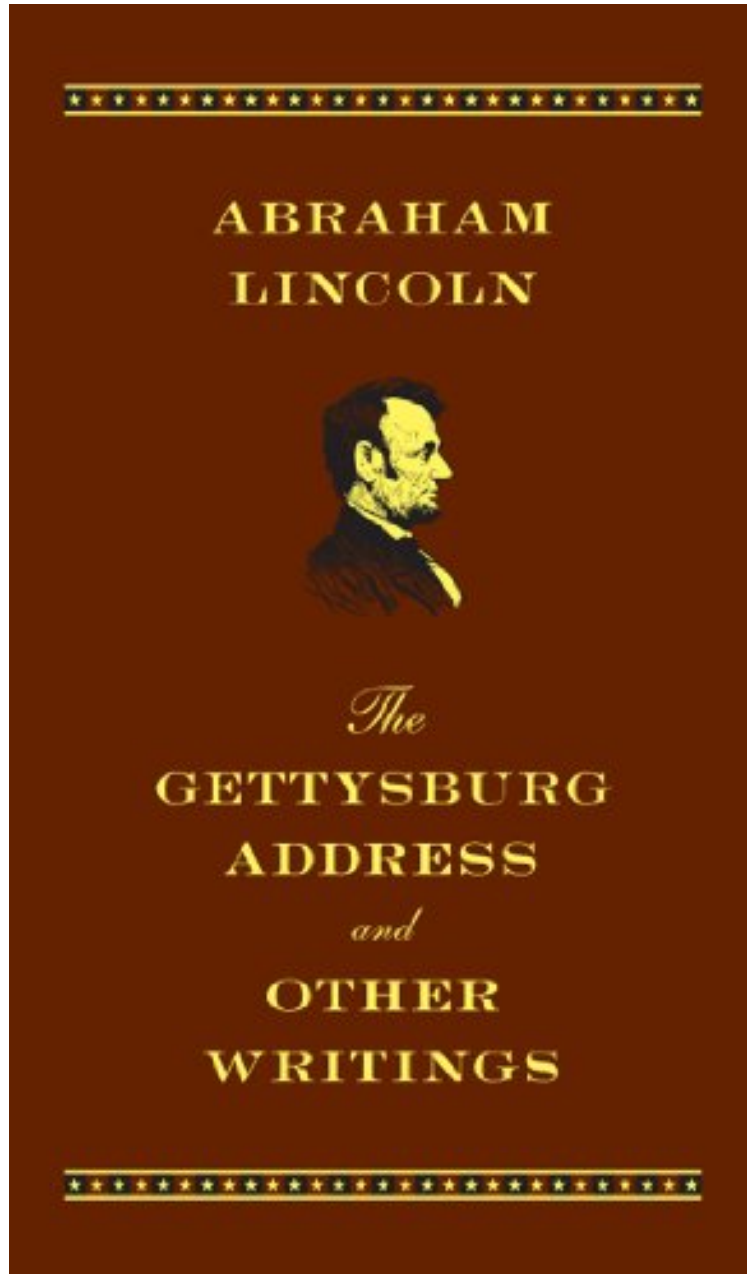

On April 14, 1865, Lincoln was shot by Confederate sympathizer John Wilkes Booth and died the following day.
