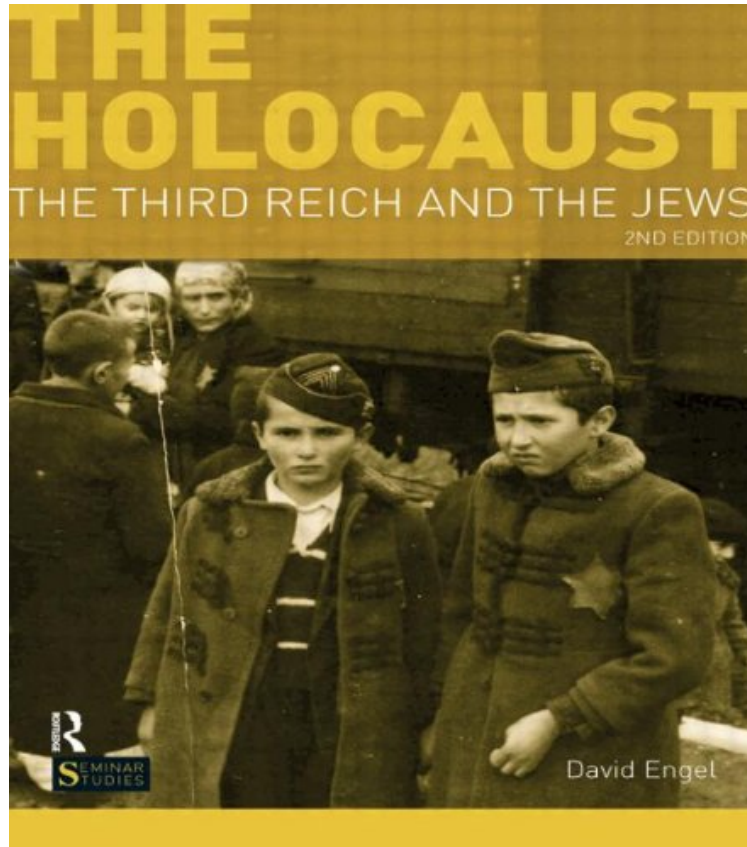

It is a masterful, summing up of an almost impossibly vast topic, and I treasure it for that substantive accomplishment, but the reason it comes to mind so frequently has to do with its length.
