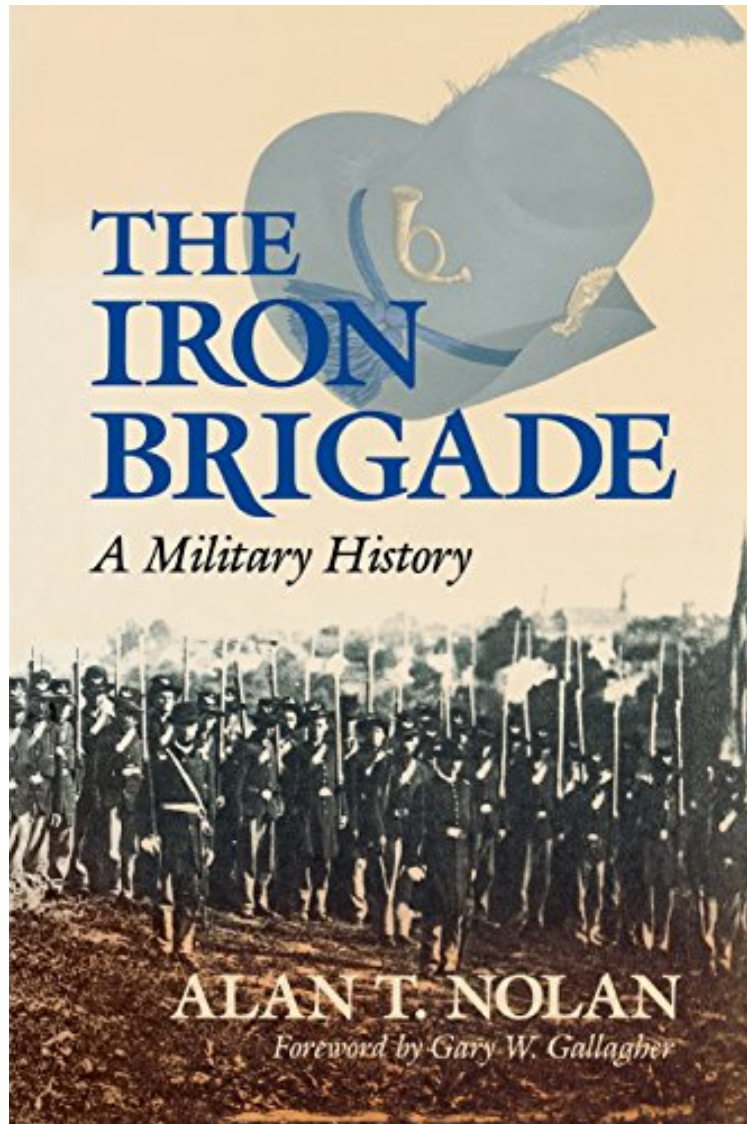

The "Black Hats" are mostly known for their role on the first day of the Gettysburg battle in support of John Buford's troops, a role that was crucial in holding the tide of rebel forces until the Union was able to bring the rest of its army to bear.
