It was a great book, heavily illustrated, and provided good background of the Battle, the fate of the original ironclads, and enhancements of later models. This book contains all the same information as the long ago book (except for the illustrations), and how some types of ironclads were used at Vicksburg. The Battle of Mobile Bay is also described with all the details of that earlier book.So why am I recommending this book? This book is written for adults. It has some details the would interest Civil War readers, and it is in print. The writing is engaging. Some of the gossipy aspects are entertaining. It even has that old Abraham Lincoln tale of the girl and the sock, though I have to admit that I am skeptical of the whole Lincoln support story.
