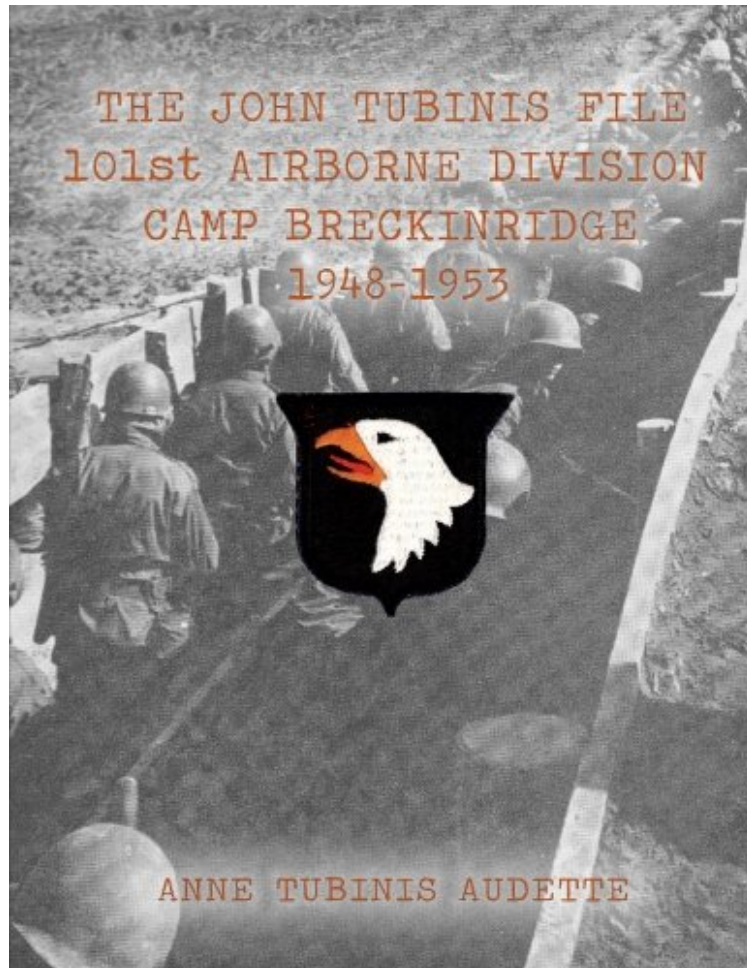

Knowing nothing about her father's army service, she began to search the internet using a description of the patch-black background, white eagle's head. Tens of thousands of men trained at Camp Breckinridge. Most are gone, even forgotten.Although some trained eight weeks, the majority trained for sixteen, the focus of this book. Kill or capture became their mindset. Follow the men to Europe, the Far East, Korea and stateside as they proudly served their country.
