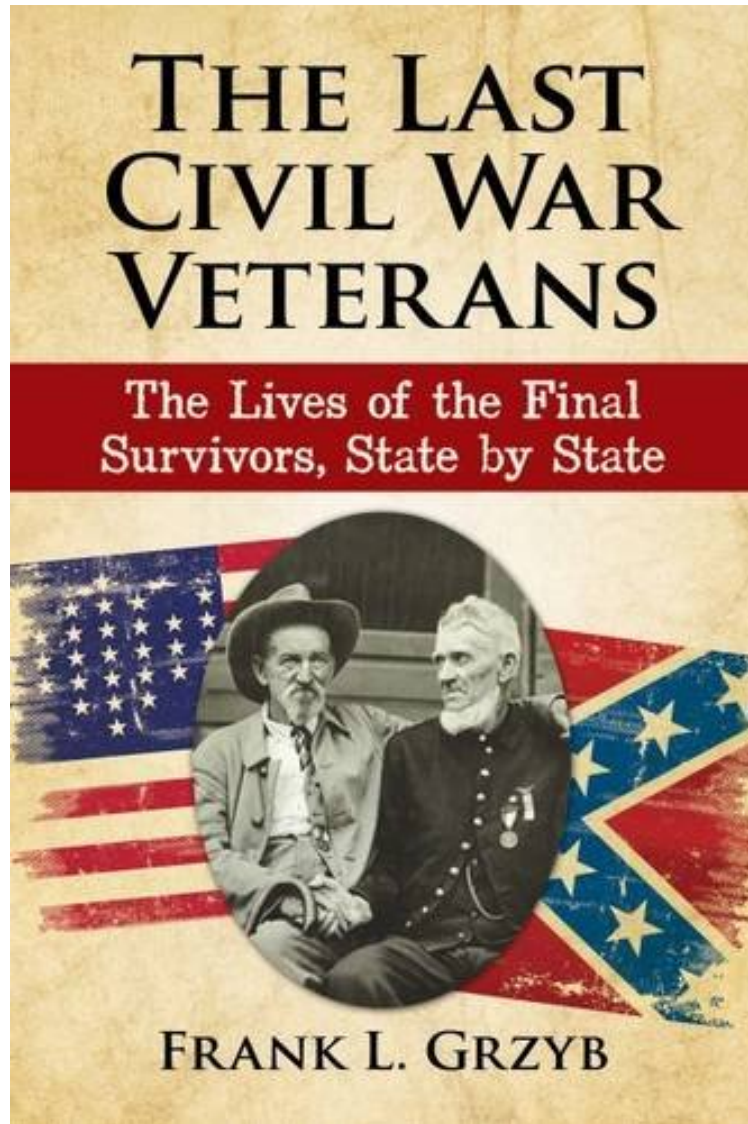

Grzyb discusses the issues over who were the last surviving veterans, the controversy surrounding some, and the ones who really weren't veterans even though they claimed to be. Appendices cover such topics as the last surviving nurses, the veterans schedule of 1890, veterans who resettled in other nations, and the last survivors of major events related to the War. There are extensive notes and a good bibliography. Most of the veterans also have accompanying photos (the reproduction quality varies). I truly enjoy the life stories of these men and highly recommend this book. The author did deep and valuable work.
